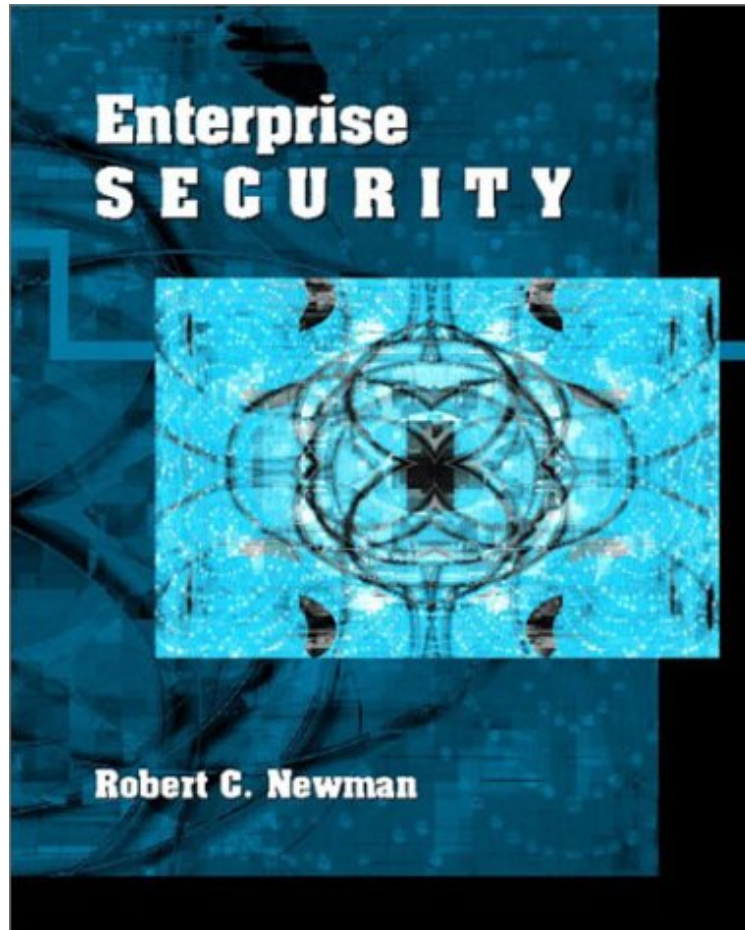

Then, since he was up against a publishing deadline, he just shuffled the papers back together and submitted them for publication. Worst Textbook ever encountered By Justin This textbook is probably the worst textbook I have ever read. The information is all shuffled improperly. Bolded keywords are often not explained, just used arbitrarily in a sentence only once. Questions and definitions at the end of the chapter do not correlate with the discussion of the chapter. Often exercises have to do with information in subsequent chapters not even read. There are mistakes not caught during proofreading. This book is extremely disorganized. Do not consider this book to teach from as it will only further frustrate students and waste valuable learning/research time.
