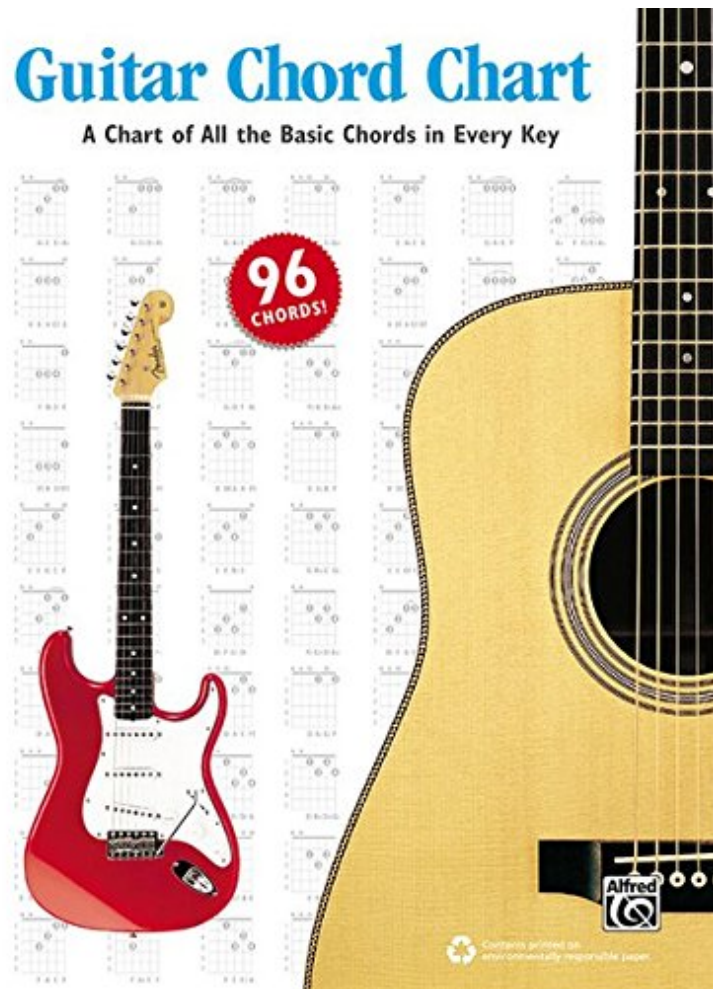

The ukulele chart was printed on a durable glossy coated paper of reasonably high quality. The paper stock used for the guitar chart was not the same. It was not glossy and apparently was less durable, since the chart arrived with a one-inch tear in from the middle of the spine on creased side. will be sending a replacement, but why isn't the paper stock for this guitar chart at least the same quality as that used for the ukulele chart?Content: This 4-page "chart booklet" measures 9" x 12" folded and 12" x 18" when opened up. When opened, the main chart (on the inside of the booklet) shows 96 open chords laid in a matrix with the

12 keys as rows, and 8 chord types (Major, Minor, Seventh, Diminished, Augmented, Major 6th, Minor 6th Ninth) as columns. The chord diagrams show recommended fingerings, but not necessarily the best fingerings (e.g. G Major using fingers 1, 2, 3, instead of 2, 3, 4, etc. YMMV). The diagrams in this main chart are probably big enough for most folks to read up close in a well lit setting. Not so with the diagrams in the "Chord Accompaniment Guide" on the back page. They are TINY! This 9" x 12" chart shows 144 open chords, with the 12 keys as rows and with the most commonly used chord types (3 principal chords, 3 relative minor chords, and 6 "alternate chords") as 12 columns. The diagrams are crisp, but just too small for older eyes in good light, and all eyes in poor light. Unfortunately, for most people, especially those with some knowledge of basic open guitar chords, the most useful information is crammed onto this single back page. It's too bad that they didn't present the two charts the other way around, with the more useful 144 chord diagram "Chord Accompaniment Guide" in the 12" x 18" fold out chart, and the basic 96 open chords on the 9" x 12" back cover. Major, minor, seventh, diminished, augmented, major 6th, minor 6th, and 9th chords are given. A chord accompaniment guide is included that shows the three principal chords, the relative minor chords, and alternate chords for each key.
