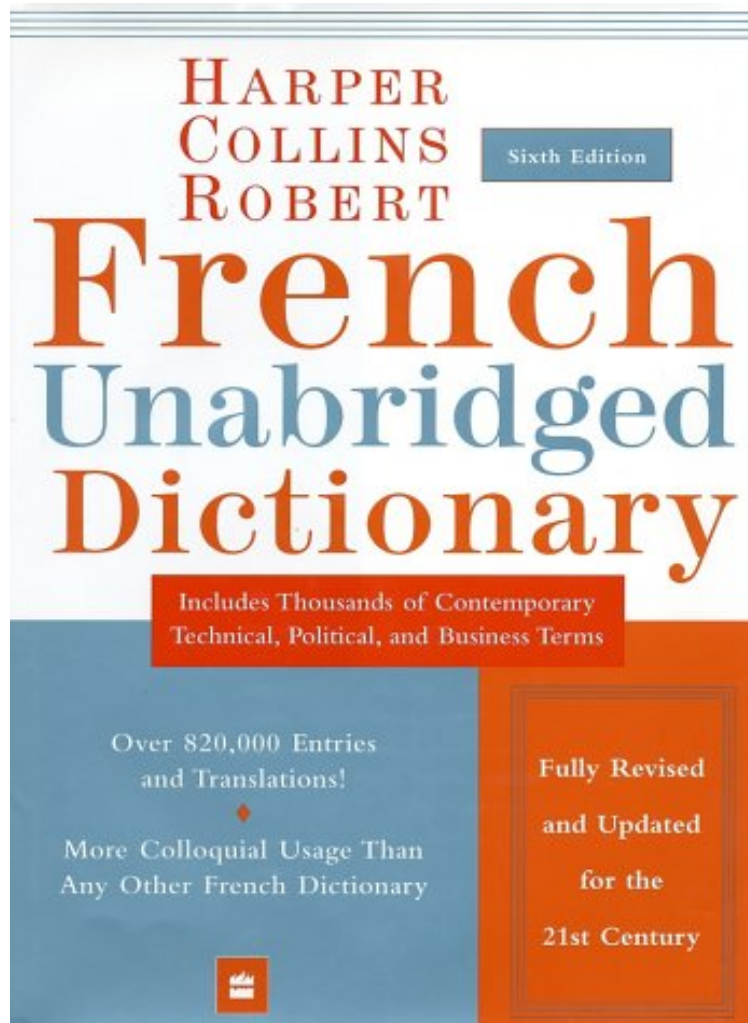

I say this because the first copy I received from had split bindings. Imagine opening the front cover and razoring the seam between the cover and the binding. Repeat the process inside the back cover.

I just wanted to point out that while Oxford-Hachette and Larousse list Entries and Translations separately in their blurbs, HarperCollins lumps them together to make it appear as though they have more than twice as many entries. This is intentionally misleading. For this reason alone I'm putting my money into the Oxford-Hachette. FWIW, this dictionary appears to be the same as the "Collins Robert Unabridged French to English and English to French Dictionary" merely by a different publisher and for half the price.
