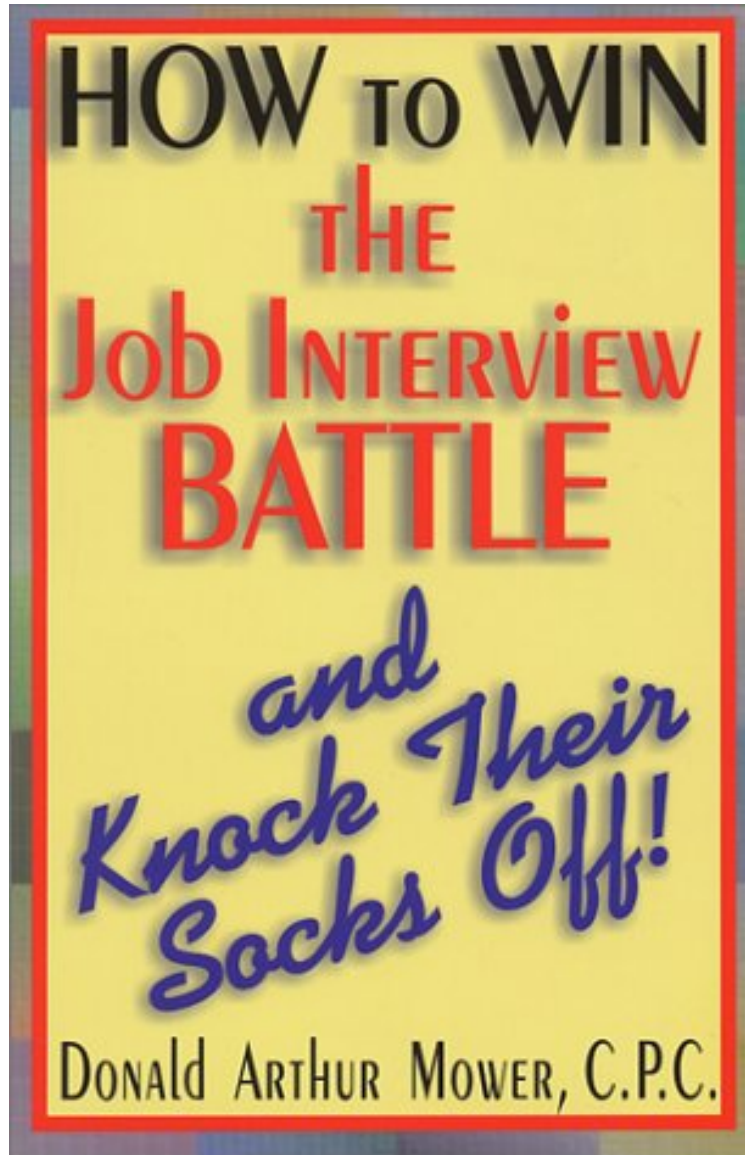

As far as I'm concerned, the job interview has always been, and continues to be the single most important hurdle to overcome in this job search. At this meeting, for an hour or so, every aspect of an individual's persona is put on trial.
